Placing Reading at the Heart of Reignhead School

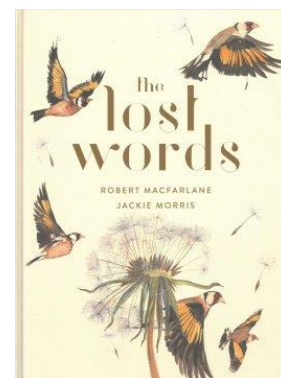
